Lucille Raines is a 49-room residence in downtown Indianapolis offering persons in recovery their next step towards independent living. The 98-year-old former Nottingham Court Hotel desperately needs to address physical accessibility concerns.

Raines offers a safe place, a supportive network, and a community connection for the residents in order for them to take the next step towards reclaiming their lives.

BRINGING HOPE AND NEW LIFE

From its inception in 1977, the Lucille Raines Residence (LRR) has sought to be one of God's instruments to lift people up and help them rebuild their lives. LRR is a safe place for people recovering from addiction to establish a solid foundation from which to move forward in life. This is our primary mission and the reason we exist.

Lucille Raines Residence has been and will continue to be one of the primary missional projects of the United Methodist Women of Indiana, whose commitment to this transformational ministry of addiction recovery has brought hope and new life to thousands of people from all across Indiana.



Ultimately, our goal for every resident is a transformed life as they personally experience God's unconditional love and forgiveness.



These one-room residences at LRR are temporary homes as residents make critical steps towards independence and freedom from their bonds of addiction.

As COVID-19 restrictions ease, these tables in the large dining room will soon host support groups, fellowship gatherings, meals, and interactions for accountability and support through recovery.





Located in downtown Indianapolis at 947 N. Pennsylvania St., Lucille Raines Residence (LRR) is known as a "three-quarter house" for recovering addicts in transition after in-patient treatment. We offer 49 private rooms on five floors in the former Nottingham Court Hotel. Our location is within walking distance, or on public transportation routes, of several employment opportunities. We consistently host 46-48 residents, evenly divided between women and men, who represent a broad sampling of races and ethnicities.



Self Responsible

Residents work 40 hours per week and pay \$130 per week for rent and utilities

Gather with others to interact and share in a supportive community which enables sustained recovery



Active In Recovery

Participate in weekly life-altering addiction support groups and stay accountable with their sponsor



Stick To The Plan

Stay a recommended 18 months to two years

We are very intentional in maintaining a nurturing environment of encouragement and accountability where hope is born anew, along with self-respect and restored dignity.

Our 98-year-old building is not ADA Accessible. Residents and visitors must first climb a flight of stairs in hope of using the elevator (maybe).




The Elevator Issues

The elevator, which starts on the 2nd floor, is very unreliable and requires costly maintenance work-a-rounds that include hand-made parts as replacements are no longer available.

Accessibility is not a problem that just goes away or solves itself in a building that dates back to the early 1920s. The renovations required to address this problem are expensive and require your help and support.
