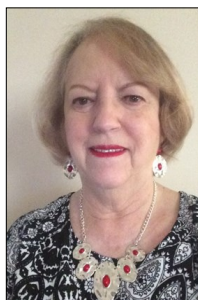

God is an amazing God! When resources do not seem to be enough, God makes a way. When the possibility of turning the Lucille Raines Residence into a residence to help recovering addicts was first proposed many people thought it would be impossible to establish. But, God had placed it in the hearts of some faithful women who trusted God and the recovery project was begun. Throughout the forty-five years since, God has shown again and again that God will make a way for the Lucille Raines Residence to continue.

The last two years have been challenging for several reasons, but God has supplied the resources to keep things going through faithful people who have responded to God's invitation to support Raines. The problem of addiction is greater today than it was when Raines was born. We who serve on the board of directors truly believe the need for Raines's ministry is greater than ever and that God continues to call us to provide help for those recovering from addiction.

We currently face two challenges. The first challenge is to inspire people to continue to support the everyday operating costs of this ministry. The second challenge is to raise the funds to make Raines accessible and replace the elevator which is no longer repairable. The elevator is essential for a six-story building.

Information has gone out to all Indiana United Methodist churches about the campaign to raise the funds for the accessibility/elevator project. The goal is \$750,000. Jesus provided enough food to feed five thousand plus people from one boy's lunch and had twelve baskets of leftovers.

Thank you for your participation in and support of the ministries God calls us to as United Women in Faith. Please be in prayer for the Lucille Raines Residence and for how God would have you participate in this ministry.

Dag Hammarskjöld's words date from 1953. They are, however, appropriate for this time of recognition of 45 years of ministry at Lucille Raines Residence. Since May 13, 1977,

LRR has been home for men and women who have become undone by their own doing. Following treatment, persons in recovery from drug and alcohol addiction have benefitted from LRR's caring, loving and sharing atmosphere. They have experienced support needed to become whole persons again.

'Tis impossible to put a price on a life transformed. That happens daily at Lucille Raines. Mid-November it was my privilege to attend a Habitat for Humanity home dedication. The person, for whom the home was built, lived at Raines until he moved into his new home. He'd been homeless 13 years prior to treatment, followed by living at Raines. Homeless to Home Owner – WOW!

Rebuilding relationships with biological family is

often a challenge encountered by persons in recovery. A current resident, who has 3 years clean, is rejoicing from spending April 2022 vacation time in Florida – timed for family to gather in celebration of her father's 80th birthday. Would that the glow of that experience could be put into words!

YOU – United Women in Faith (UMW), churches, individuals – are intertwined in these stories. Thank you for being present with resources and prayers across these 45 years.

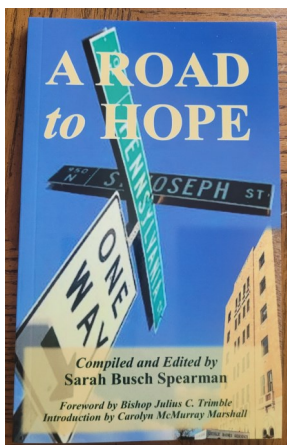
